Preface

This list of names of The Fallen of Glasgow's East-end records some of the millions of victims of the bloodiest wars in world history. The names, extracted from 'The City of Glasgow Roll of Honour of The Great War' (1922) compiled by the late Kevin O'Neil, were subsequently checked against the CWGC site for date of death, grave reference and/or memorial panel reference and next of kin. Any errors or omissions are entirely mine. I need only add that I set myself an enormous task in extracting this list of names from the 18,000 recorded on The City of Glasgow Roll of Honour (1922). In striving for accuracy I have done my best. Having been born and bred in Bridgeton I was familiar with the street names and I must say I found it a poignant exercise one way and another, having walked many of those familiar streets in the distant past. Moreover, in remembering an Uncle, likewise raised in Bridgeton, who died at St. Julian during the Second Battle of Ypres in April 1915, the list became my personal tribute to the Fallen Heroes of Glasgow's East-end. Their gallantry is commemorated in this Casualty List of names of sons, husbands' fathers and brothers in localised clusters of death. The supreme sacrifice of the district is exemplified in the tragedy that befell the late Mr and Mrs Dunn of 527 Dalmarnock Road, Bridgeton whose three sons were killed in action. These brothers in arms namely, Private Colin M DUNN, 9th Bn. Cameronians (Scottish Rifles); Private Archie DUNN, 6th Bn. Cameron Highlanders and Lance Corporal Richard DUNN, 6th Bn. Cameron Highlanders fought died at the Battle of Loos (1915). Colin (23) and Richard (26) died 25th September. Elder brother Archie (35) died the following day. The names of these three, with no known grave, are inscribed on Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais, France. They have passed from the sight of men, but their names liveth forever.

S/4338 Private ABBOTT Robert - 8/10th Bn, Gordon Highlanders. October, 1916. Robert died of wounds 10th October, 1916 received during Battle of the Somme. He was part of 44th 15th Scottish Division. The 8/10th Battalion had been in constant fighting from 14th August, 1916 and he may have been wounded in any of the following actions in which the 8/10th Battalion fought. These included Scots Redoubt, Contalmaison, Albert, The Dingle, The Quadrangle, Bazentia Le Petit, The Cutting, Martinpuich, Lavieville and Frauvillers. Grave Reference: Plot III. Row F. Grave 20. Dernancourt Communal Cemetery Extension. Location: Somme, France. Dernancourt is a village 3 kms south of Albert. The Communal Cemetery is a little west of the village, and the Extension is on the north-west side of the Communal Cemetery. Robert was born in Bridgeton and resided at 9 Hozier Street, Bridgeton.

414044 Sergeant ABERNETHY David - 410th Cov and 1st/2nd Field Cov. Roval Engineers. David was killed in action 2nd November, 1917 during the 3rd Battle of Gaza. Age 26. Grave Reference: XXXI. G. 9. Gaza War Cemetery. Location: Israel and Palestine (including Gaza). Gaza is 3 kms inland from the Mediterranean coast, 65 kms south-west of Tel Aviv. From Israel stop at the Erez Crossing point and enter the VIP cabin for a pass to enter Gaza. Walk through "no man's land" to the taxis on the other side. Gaza War Cemetery is 1.5 kms north-east of the city near the Bureir Road and 370 metres from the railway station. The cemetery is approximately 8 kms to the left of the main dual carriageway, Highway 250 through Gaza, and is about 200 mtrs back from the road through an avenue of trees. Alternatively, turn left off the highway after 4 kms, continuing with Highway 4 until Sha'arei Aza junction and turn right, then turn right into Gaza proper, heading back towards the border. In this direction the cemetery will be found on the right hand side after approximately 3 kms. David was born in Penicuik, enlisted in Rutherglen and resided at 458 Baltic Street Bridgeton.

2707 Private ADAM - 6 Bn. (City of Glasgow) Highland Light Infantry. He was part of 157th Brigade 52nd (Lowland) Division and had previously served with the 3rd Bn. HLI Number 6729. John was killed in action 12th July, 1915 in Mesopotamia during the capture of Nasiriyeh. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 35 and 36. Basra Memorial. Location: Iraq. Born Glasgow. Enlisted Glasgow. Resided 79 Norman Street Bridgeton.

54741 Bombardier ADAMS R - 113th Bty. 25th Bde. Royal Field Artillery. Robert, age 30, died of wounds 6th September, 1918 received in the Arras sector in France during the final Allied advance towards victory when the German army valiantly fought a rearguard action which inflicted heavy casualties on the advancing Allies. Grave Reference: IV. C. 19. Ligny-St-Flochel British Cemetery, Averdoingt. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Ligny-St. Fochel is a village about 6.5 kms east of St. Pol off the main road to Arras, approximately 24 kms from Arras. Ligny-St. Fochel British Cemetery is south of the village on the east side of the road (D81) to the village of Averdoingt. Son of Robert and Anna Adams, 78 Reid Street, Bridgeton. Born in Glasgow. Enlisted in Glasgow.

326439 Private AGNEW James - 1st/7th Bn. Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. James was killed in action 12th October, 1918 in the Cambrai Sector in France during an attack three and a half miles from Cambrai Station. As in the case of the above named Bombardier Robert Adams, James died during the final Allied Advance to victory. L/Cpl. Agnew was part of 154th Brigade, 51st Highland Division. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 10. Vis-en-Artois Memorial. Location; Pas de Calais, France. Vis-en-Artois and Haucourt are villages on the straight main road from Arras to Cambrai about 10 kms south-east of Arras. The Memorial is the back drop to the Vis-en-Artois British Cemetery, which is west of Haucourt on the north side of the main road. James was born in Glasgow and resided at 47 James Street Calton.

6220 Private AITKEN Daniel 2nd Bn. Kings Own Scottish Borderers. Daniel died 25th December, 1918 while a prisoner of war in Germany. He was part of 13th Brigade, 5th Division. Born Glasgow. Enlisted Glasgow. Daniel resided at 72 Anderson Street, Calton.

277188 Corporal AITKEN James - 1st/7th Bn. Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. James died 11th April. 1918. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 125 to 127. Loos Memorial. Location: Pas de Calais, France. The Loos Memorial forms the sides and back of Dud Corner Cemetery. Loos-en-Gobelle is a village 5 kms north-west of Lens, and Dud Corner Cemetery is located about 1 km west of the village, to the north-east of the N943, the main Lens to Bethune road. James resided at 125 Main Street, Bridgeton.

S/5279 Private AITKEN James - 1st Battalion Seaforth Highlanders. James died 1st November, 1915. Aged 19, Grave Reference VIII.C.54. Boulogne Eastern Cemetery. Locality: Pas de Calais, France. Boulogne-sur-Mer is a large Channel port. Boulogne Eastern Cemetery, one of the town cemeteries, lies in the district of St. Martin Boulogne, just beyond the eastern (Chateau) corner of the Citadel (Haute-Ville). The cemetery is a large civil cemetery, split in two by the Rue de Dringhen, just south of the main road 9(RN42) to St. Omer. The Commonwealth War Graves plot is located down the western edge of the southern section of the cemetery, with an entrance in the Rue de Dringhen. Unusually, the headstones are laid flat in this cemetery. This is due to the sandy soil. Car parking is available along the Rue de Dringhen. Son of John and Grace Aitken, 45 New Street, Calton.

4326 Sergeant ALEXANDER R - 18th Bn. Highland Light Infantry. Alexander died 25th August, 1917. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference. Pier and Face 15 C. Thiepval Memorial. Location: Somme, France. The Thiepval Memorial will be found on the D73, next to the village of Thiepval, off the main Bapaume to Albert road (D929). Each year a major ceremony is held at the memorial on 1st July. Alexander resided at 38 Howard Street, Bridgeton.

10277 Private ALEXANDER Richard - 2nd Bn. Highland Light Infantry. Richard died 5th November, 1914. Age 26. No Known Grave. Special Memorial: Commemorated on Grange Gorman (Cork) Memorial Headstones. Location: Republic of Ireland, County Dublin. The Grangegorman (Cork) Memorial Headstones commemorate the graves of 83 war dead who are buried in Cork Military Cemetery, but whose graves could not be maintained there. The headstones of the 83 War Dead are arranged before the Grangegorman Memorial which is located in Grangegorman Military Cemetery on Blackhorse Avenue outside the north-east boundary of Phoenix Park. Alternative Commemoration - buried in Cork Military Cemetery. Son of Hugh and Mary Alexander,16 Savoy Street, Bridgeton (sometime of 47 Reid Street, Bridgeton).

13060 Lance Corporal ALLAN David Lance Corporal - 15th Bn. Highland Light Infantry. David died 24th March, 1918. Age 34. Grave Reference: III. H. 11. Canada Farm Cemetery. Location: West Vlaanderen, Belgium. Canada Farm Cemetery is located 8.5 kms north-west of Ypres town centre, on the Elzendammestraat, a road leading from the Veurnseweg (N8) connecting Ypres to Elverdinge and on to Veurne. From Ypres town centre the Veurnseweg (N8) is reached via Elverdingsestraat, then turning right on to Haiglaan. Veurnseweg is a continuation of Haiglaan. On reaching the village of Elverdinge the Steentjesmolenstraat, N333, leads towards Poperinge. 2 kms along the Steentjesmolenstraat lies the right hand turning on to Elzendammestraat. The cemetery itself is located 1 km along the Elzendammestraat on the right hand side of the road. Son of Thomas Allan, 5 Nuneaton Street, Bridgeton.

ALLAN William Private Highland Light Infantry 19 London Road. Unable to verify as there are several of same name, rank and regiment recorded on CWGC with no additional and/or matching details.

ALLAN William Private Highland Light Infantry 408 London Road. Unable to verify as there are several of same name, rank and regiment recorded on CWGC with no additional and/or matching details.

ALLAN William Private Seaforth Highlanders 17 Bernard Street, Bridgeton. Unable to verify as there are several of same name, rank and regiment recorded on CWGC with no additional and/or matching details.

33307 Private ALLIN, Albert Edward - Royal Scots, 2nd/10th Battalion. Albert died 6th January,1919. Aged 42. Memorial: Archangel Memorial. Location: Archangel, in the north of the Russian Federation. Archangel is a town on the eastern side of the Dvina Estuary on the White Sea. The Archangel Memorial is located at the far end of Archangel Allied Cemetery which is on the north-west outskirts of the town of Archangel, adjoining the Lutheran and Russian cemeteries and memorials to those who died in more recent actions. The Archangel Memorial, which consists of panels fixed into the east wall of the cemetery, commemorates 219 British officers and men who died during the north Russian campaign and whose graves are not known. Husband of Mary A. Allin, 45 Colvend Street, Bridgeton.

202777 Private ANDERSON Arthur - 1st/5th Bn. Kings Own Scottish Borderers. Arthur died of wounds on 28th 'August, 1918. When sustained is unknown, but he most likely died in the 44th Casualty Clearing Station, since 44th Casualty Clearing Station used this cemetery to bury the men who died from wounds. Grave Reference: Plot II. Row 'A'. Grave 11. Croix-Rouge Military Cemetery. Quaedpyre. Location: Quaedpyre, Nord, France. Arthur was part of 155th Brigade, 52nd Lowland Division. Born Elgin, Morayshire. Enlisted Glasgow. Son of Alexander and Jessie Anderson, 190 Baltic Street, Bridgeton.

Private ANDERSON Alexander Private Seaforth Highlanders 72 Bain Street, Bridgeton. **No Results Found.**

318075 Private ANDERSON Gavin - 1st Bn. Seaforth Highlanders. Gavin was killed in action on 9th May, 1915 during Battle of Aubers where 494 members of the Battalion were among those killed, wounded and missing. He was almost certainly a regular soldier and was part of the Dehra Dun Brigade, Meerut Indian Division. Gavin was born in the Barony district of Glasgow and enlisted in Glasgow. Private Anderson has no known grave. Memorial Panel: 38 and 39. Le Touret Memorial. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Resided 137 Barrack Street, Calton.

S/3314 Corporal ANDERSON George - 1st Bn. Gordon Highlanders. George died 3rd April, 1916, during the actions of the St. Eloi Craters which at that time was the most mined sector in the war with many casualties from the underground mind explosions. He was age 19 and part of the 66th Brigade, 3rd Division. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 38. Ypres (Menin Gate Memorial). Location: West Vlaanderen, Belgium. Ypres (now leper) is a town in the Province of West Flanders. The Memorial is situated at the eastern side of the town on the road to Menin (Menen) and Courtrai (Kortrijk). Each night at 8 pm the traffic is stopped at the Menin Gate while members of the local Fire Brigade sound the Last Post in the roadway under the Memorial's arches. George was born in Glasgow where he also enlisted. Son of James and Amy Anderson, 64 Bernard Street, Bridgeton.

S/5280 Private ANDERSON George W - 2nd Bn. Seaforth Highlanders. George was killed in action 12th December, 1916. Although Battle of the Somme had officially finished on 18th November, fighting continued in the Somme sector. George was part of the 10th Brigade, 4th Division. Grave Reference: Plot III. Row C. Grave 9. Sailly-Sallisel British Cemetery. Location: Somme, France. George was born in Govan. Enlisted: Glasgow. Prior to the war, George worked for Messrs. James Templeton & Co. Ltd (Carpet Manufacturers). He was born in Govan and enlisted in Glasgow. Resided 110 French Street, Bridgeton.

377535 Private ANDERSON John - 10th/11th Bn. Highland Light infantry. John

died 28th August, 1917. Age 27. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 131 to 132. Tyne Cot Memorial. Location: West Vlaanderen, Belgium. The Tyne Cot Memorial to the Missing forms the north-eastern boundary of Tyne Cot Cemetery, which is located 9 kms north-east of Ypres town centre, on the Tynecotstraat, a road leading from the Zonnebeekseweg (N332). The names of those from United Kingdom units are inscribed on Panels arranged by Regiment and under their respective Ranks. The names of those from New Zealand units are inscribed on panels within the New Zealand Apse located at the centre of the Memorial. Son of Duncan and Jane Baxter Anderson, 755 Gallowgate.

12105 Private ANDERSON John - 11th Bn. Royal Scots. John was killed in action 27th September, 1915, Battle of Loos during the loss of Fosse 8. He was part of 27th Brigade 9th (Scottish) Division. Born: South Shields, Durham. Enlisted: Glasgow. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 10 to 18. Loos Memorial. Location: Pas de Calais, France. The Loos Memorial forms the sides and back of Dud Corner Cemetery. Loos-en-Gobelle is a village 5 kms north-west of Lens, and Dud Corner Cemetery is located about 1 km west of the village, to the north-east of the N943, the main Lens to Bethune road. Private Anderson resided at 281 London Road.

56620 Private ANDERSON Robert - 15th S/Bn. Highland Light infantry. Robert was killed in action on 2nd July, 1918 - possibly in the Arras sector. He was part of 14th Brigade, 32nd Division. The 15th Battalion was also known as the Glasgow Tramways Battalion owing to the number of tramway employees within its ranks. Grave Reference: Plot II. Row E. Grave 14. Bac-Du-Sud British Cemetery, Bailleulval. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Bailleulval is a village in the Department of the Pas-de-Calais about 13 kms south-west of Arras, and the cemetery is 1 km west of the village on the north side of the main road from Arras to Doullens (N25). Son of Mr and Mrs James Anderson, 281 London Road.

17184 Private ANDERSON William - 9th Bn. Cameronians (Scottish Rifles). William was killed in action 6th July, 1916 during Battle of the Somme. The Battalion diary states that it was in the trenches at Montauban between 3rd and 8th July during which time the Battalion suffered 139 casualties including William. He was part of 27th Brigade, 9th (Scottish) Division. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Pier and Face 4 D. Thiepval Memorial. Location: Somme, France. The Thiepval Memorial will be found on the D73, next to the village of Thiepval, off the main Bapaume to Albert Road (D929). Private Anderson was born and resided at 17 Ardenlea Street, Dalmarnock.

14464 A/Sergeant ANDERSON William - 13th Bn. Royal Scots. During a German attack on the chink in the Loos sector, William was killed in action on 11th May, 1916. Age 22. He was part of 45th Battalion, 15th (Scottish) Division. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Panel 10 to 13, Loos Memorial, Location: Pas de Calais, France, The Loos Memorial forms the sides and back of Dud Corner Cemetery. Loos-en-Gohelle is a village 5 kms north-west

of Lens, and Dud Corner Cemetery is located about 1 km west of the village, to the north-east of the N943, the main Lens to Bethune road. Son of Mrs Grace Anderson, 25 Marnock Street, Mile-End.

147011 Private ANDREW Hugh Arbuckle - Canadian Expeditionary Force 78th Battalion Canadian Infantry, <u>Mentioned in Despatches</u>. Andrew died 19th February, 1917. Age 24. Andrew's name is inscribed on the Vimy Memorial. Location: Pas de Calais, France. The Vimy Memorial overlooks the Douai Plain from the highest point of Vimy Ridge, about 18 kms north-east of Arras on the N17 towards Lens. The Memorial is signposted from this road to the left, just before you enter the village of Vimy from the south. The memorial itself is some way inside the memorial park, but again it is well signposted. Son of William Andrew and Jessie Arbuckle Andrew late of 90 Great Hamilton Street.

316437 Private ANDREWS James Porter - 13th (Scottish Horse) Bn. Black Watch (Royal Highlanders). James died 17th October, 1918. Age 24. Grave Reference: III. B. 15. Highland Cemetery, Le Cateau. Location: Nord, France. Le Cateau is a small town about 19 kms south-east of Cambral. Highland Cemetery is about 1 km south of the town on the D12 road to Wassigny. Son of John and Elizabeth Andrews, 28 Carsehead Row, Dalry, Ayrshire. James resided at 72 Bain Street, Calton.

10003 Private ANDREWS John - 1st Battalion Scots Guards. John died 15th September, 1916. Age 22. Memorial Panel Reference: Pier and Face 7.D. Thiepval Memorial. Location: Somme, France. The Thiepval Memorial will be found on the D73, next to the village of Thiepval, off the main Bapaume to Albert Road (D929). Son of James and Isabella Andrews, 123 Green Street Calton.

3252 Sergeant ANDREWS William - 16th Bn. Highland Light Infantry. William died 1st July, 1916 (the first day of the Battle of the Somme). Its first day resulted in 57,000 casualties and was the bloodiest in British military history. On average, 3 lives were lost for every 12" of ground gained. The battle was fought from a bright July to a bitter November. Sergeant Andres has no known grave: Memorial Panel Reference: Pier and Face 15 C. Thiepval Memorial. Location: Somme, France. The Thiepval Memorial will be found on the D73, next to the village of Thiepval, off the main Bapaume to Albert road (D929). Each year a major ceremony is held at the memorial on 1st July. William resided at 28 Bell Street, Calton.

S/21267 Private ANGELY James - 6th Bn. Cameron Highlanders. James died 22nd January, 1917. Grave Reference: III. A. 4. Arras Road Cemetery, Roclincourt. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Roclincourt is a village a little east of the road from Arras to Lens and Lille. Arras Road Cemetery is on the west side of the main N17 road from Arras to Lens, about 6 kms north of Arras, and north of the village of Ecuries. James resided at 427 Gallowgate.

26779 Private ANGUS James - 2nd Bn. Highland Light Infantry. James died 1st July, 1916, Grave Reference: II, A. 13, Cabaret-Rouge British Cemetery, Souchez. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Cabaret Rouge was a small, red-bricked, red-tiled café that stood close to this site in the early days of the First World War. The café was destroyed by shellfire in March, 1915, but it gave its unusual name to this sector and to a communication trench that led troops up the front-line. Commonwealth soldiers began burying their fallen comrades here in March, 1916. The cemetery was used mostly by the 47th (London) Division and the Canadian Corps until August, 1917 and by different fighting units until September, 1918. It was greatly enlarged in the years after the war when as many as 7,000 graves were concentrated here from over 100 other cemeteries in the area. For much of the 20th century, Cabaret Rouge served as one of a small number of 'open cemeteries' at which the remains of fallen servicemen newly discovered in the region were buried. Today, the cemetery contains over 7,650 burials of the First World War, over half of which remain unidentified. Many different Commonwealth units served in this sector during the war and the cemetery contains the graves of British. Irish, Australian, New Zealand, Indian and South African soldiers, It is also the final resting place of over 70 officers of the Royal Flying Corps and Royal Air Force. Cabaret Rouge has a particularly close connection with the Canadian Infantry, however, hundreds of Canadians who were killed at the Battle of Vimy Ridge in April, 1917 were laid to rest here. In May, 2000, the remains of an unknown Canadian soldier were taken from this cemetery and buried in a special tomb at the foot of the National War Memorial in Ottawa, Canada. A focal point for remembrance, he represents more than 116,000 Canadians who lost their during the First World War. A headstone in Plot 8, Row E, Grave 7 marks his original grave. Private Angus resided at 194 London Road, Bridgeton.

8901 Sapper ANGUS Robert - 1st/1st (Highland) Field Coy, Royal Engineers. Robert died 24th June, 1915. Age 19. Grave Reference II.A.16. Lillers Communal Cemetery. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Lillers is a small town about 15 kms west-north-west of Bethune and the Communal Cemetery and Extension lie to the north of the town. From the Mairie in the centre of the town, head north on the D182, after 500 mtrs turn right on to Rue St Venant. The cemetery is a further 200 mtrs on the left hand side. Within the Communal Cemetery the commonwealth war graves are situated on the right hand side half way up the cemetery central path, and the Extension is at the far right end of the Communal Cemetery. Both cemeteries are signposted. Son of Matthew Angus and Catherine McD. McGregor Angus,134 Claythorn Street, Calton.

ARMSTRONG Francis J Private Royal Scots Fusiliers 152 Abercromby Street. **No results found.**

3521 Private ARMSTRONG James - 1st/8th Bn. Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. James died 13th November, 1916. No Known Grave. Memorial Panel Reference: Pier and Face 15 A and 16 C. Thiepval Memorial. Location: Somme, France. The Thiepval Memorial will be found on the D73, next to the village of Thiepval, off the main Bapaume to Albert road (D929). Each year a major ceremony is held at the Memorial on 1st July. James resided at 19 Newhall Street, Bridgeton.

28783 Private ARMSTRONG Leo Arthur - 2nd Battalion Royal Scots Fusiliers. Leo died 28th March, 1918. Age 20. Memorial Panel Reference 34 and 35. Pozieres Memorial. Location: Somme, France. Pozieres is a village 6 kms north-east of the town of Albert. The memorial encloses Pozieres British Cemetery which is a little south-west of the village on the north side of the main road, D929, from Albert to Pozieres. On the road frontage is an open arcade terminated by small buildings and broken in the middle by the entrance gates. Along the sides and the back, stone tablets are fixed in the stone rubble walls bearing the names of the dead grouped under their regiments. Although the memorial stand in a cemetery of largely Australian graves, it does not bear any Australian names. The Australian soldiers who fell in France and whose graves are not known are commemorated on the National Memorial at Villers-Bretonneux. Son of Joseph and Sarah Armstrong, 152 Abercromby Street.

10786 Private ARMSTRONG William - 5th Battalion Cameron Highlanders. William died 27th September, 1917. Age 26. Grave Reference: IV.E.22. Bethune Town Cemetery. Location: Pas de Calais, France. Bethune is a town 29 kms north of Arras. The cemetery can easily be found, from any point in Bethune, by following the French signs indicating 'CIMETIERE NORD'. From the town centre, turn right in front of the Tribunal and second right at the bottom of the road down to the cul-de-sac where the cemetery will be found . Based at Sheerness in Kent, she was in the River Medway on 27th May, 1915 when she blew up without warning as a result of a catastrophic internal explosion. The HMS "Princess Irene" had a complement of 225 officers and men. Also on board were a party of 80 or so Petty Officers from Chatham in addition to 76 Sheerness Dockvard workers who were completing tasks prior to the ship's planned departure to lay her mines on 29th May. The sole survivor was one of the Chatham Dockyard workers, David Wills, who amazingly survived the explosion, but few bodies were found. Those that were located were buried in Woodlands Cemetery on Gillingham. The ship was blown to pieces and her remains, and the remains of those on board, were scattered over a wide area of the surrounding river and countryside. A memorial to those lost in both this and the Bulwark disaster is situated opposite Sheerness Railway Station. The cause of the disaster was thought to have been due to a faulty primer (pistol) although evidence at the Official Enguiry showed that the work of priming the lethal mines was being carried out (a) in a hurry and (b) by untrained personnel. The lower decks and keel of the "Princess Irene" remain more or less intact and have caused a degree of navigational problems to the large ships now using the eastern end of nearby Thamesport.
